Dear parishioners,

The Temple of the Holy Spirit

No religion takes the body as seriously as does the Christian religion. The body is not seen as the enemy of the spirit, or as a prison of the spirit. Through Christ's birth, life, death and resurrection, the human body has become part of the life of God. There is no place in Christianity for contempt of the body. But neither is there a place for worship of the body.

We are God's creature. Our body is the work of God. That is reason enough for respecting it and caring for it. But St. Paul gives us further and deeper reason for respecting the body. He says, "Your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit"

Today, there is a cult of the body, especially in modeling and advertising – a cult of the body apart from the person. It is the body that counts, not the person. And it is always a young and beautiful body. Needless to say, this is not what St. Paul is talking about. This is not respect. This is more like exploitation.

Today there is also huge interest in physical fitness and physical health. While this is welcome, it should be kept in perspective. Care of the body should not result in neglect of the soul. Bodily health should not be sought at the expense of health of the soul. Vanity should not be what drives the need for bodily health. It is not just the matter of muscle building and the toning up of muscles. It should stem from our belief that our bodies are God's Temple, worthy of care and loving.

The Church respects the body from the beginning of life to the end, from that of a tiny infant to an elderly person. At baptism it pours water over the body of the child. It anoints it not once but twice. It adorns it with a white robe. At the end of life it again anoints and blesses the body of the Christian. Even when life has gone out of it, it still considers it sacred. The Church buries it in consecrated ground. And when cremation occurs the church urges that the ashes be treated with respect.

Again, this is because the Church regards the body as a temple in which the Holy Spirit dwells. Moreover, in the incarnation Jesus took on a body like ours. He lived, suffered and died in our flesh. And he rose from the dead and was glorified in our flesh. This is another reason for respecting the body: it is destined for eternal glory. "God will raise up these mortal bodies and make them like his own in glory" (St Paul).

We do not show respect for our bodies by the sins of the flesh, or by overindulgence in food and drink.

Once in a small town in Poland a young boy stood watching a gypsy as he drank from a well in the town square. After drinking, the man stood there, gazing down into the well, as though looking at someone. He was a giant of a man but had a friendly face. So the little boy approached him and asked, "Who lives down there?"

"God does", answered the gypsy

"Can I see him?"

"Of course you can" said the gypsy.

Then he took the boy in his arms, lifting him up so that he could see down into the well. All the boy could see, however, was his own reflection in the water.

"But that's only me," he cried in disappointment. "All I can see is me".

"Ah," replied the gypsy, "now you know where God lives. He lives in you".

Yes, God lives in you and me. God bless you, dear Temple of the Spirit.

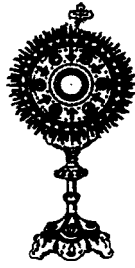

Faith First for Families

Sunday Gospel Reflections for January 15, 2012

John 1:35-42

Gospel Summary - Jesus begins to call his disciples in this gospel passage. Two of John the Baptist's disciples were standing with him when Jesus approached them. John pointed out to his disciples that Jesus was the Lamb of God. The disciples may have left John to follow Jesus at first out of curiosity, but soon they knew there was something compelling about his invitation. While they didn't clearly understand all that this meant, they allowed themselves to be led by Jesus.

Reflection for Families - Try to imagine the excitement these first disciples felt when they heard Jesus' words. There must have been something very compelling in what Jesus said and the hope he gave these men in order for them to drop everything and not only follow him, but to go to others with the exciting news. That's how our enthusiasm should reach our children. It would be good to check our own level of enthusiasm for Jesus' call to us so that whenever our children hear our words and stories about Jesus, they will immediately recognize our passion.

Bringing the Gospel into your Family - Ask each family member to list the five most important things in their lives. These may be possessions, people, or things that can't be touched such as health. As each person explains their priorities, try to help one another see where God is in each item listed. After all have had a chance to share their lists and the family has talked together, check with family members to see if they would change their list in any way.
