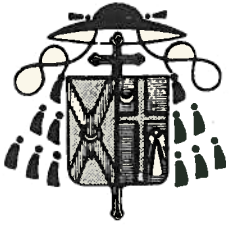

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

With a heavy heart, I write to you today to call your attention to an important development which threatens the fundamental right to religious liberty for all citizens of any faith.

The United States Department of Health and Human Services announced on January 20, 2012, that almost all employers will now be mandated to offer employees health coverage that includes sterilization, abortion-inducing drugs and contraception.

As a result, unless the ruling is overturned, we Catholics will be required either to violate our consciences or drop health coverage for our employees.

As we have done in the past, so now we must make our voices heard on this important matter of religious freedom.

Therefore, I ask two things of you: First, as a community of faith, to commit ourselves to prayer and fasting that wisdom and justice might prevail, and that true religious liberty might be restored. Without God, we can do nothing; with God, nothing is impossible. Second, I ask you individually to visit www.usccb.org/conscience to learn about this assault on religious liberty, and to learn how to contact Congress in support of legislation that will reverse this administrative decision.

May God bless our efforts to do what is right.

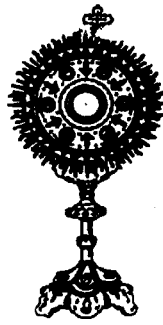

Faith First for Families

Sunday Gospel Reflections for February 5, 2012

Mark 1:29-39

Gospel Summary - We learn several important pieces of information from this gospel passage. First, Simon Peter had a mother-in-law. When we read previously that he left his fishing boat to follow Jesus, we can safely assume that he left much more than that. He had a family at home and we hear in this gospel of Jesus healing Peter's mother-in-law. Also, this gospel helps us recognize the need Jesus had to be away from the crowds and confusion to take time to pray and become revitalized and strengthened for his ministry.

Reflection for Families - This gospel is especially helpful for parents. Many (maybe most) nights we fall into bed exhausted from a day of responsibilities. Perhaps it was our intention throughout the day to find time to pray, but sometimes we just don't get to it. At the end of the day, we resolve to talk with God, but wake in the morning to find out we fell asleep before we finished the prayer. Jesus gives us the example that we must take the time away from the busyness and demands of our lives to be fortified and strengthened to meet the most important responsibilities we have—that is the spiritual formation of our children and our family.

Bringing the Gospel into your Family - If you don't have a place in your home where you gather as a family to pray, this gospel may give you the incentive to establish one. Just a small table with a Bible on it will do. Allow all the members of your family to participate in its preparation by adding items that help everyone feel connected with the area. Try to establish a family ritual of prayer - perhaps before meals and at bedtime, when you gather in this area to pray together. This is a good opportunity to teach children traditional prayers, but it is also a place where they may speak from their hearts with petitions, praise, and thanksgiving.
