Sharing the Story

The death of Jesus has plunged the disciples into gloom. Two of them have taken leave of the rest and are on their way back home to Emmaus. Their dreams about Jesus as the long awaited Messiah is gone. They talk about their dreams and just cannot make any sense of anything. The Jesus joins them and shows great sensitivity by joining them as a stranger. People often find it easier to talk to a stranger. With a simple direct question, asked in a kindly manner, he got them to open up and they began to pour out their sad story to him; and he listened patiently and lovingly.

What Jesus did was accompany them. Whatever age we are, we need someone to talk with us. Accompaniment is something very gentle. Through it, communion is gradually built up, and mutual trust and a desire for the truth increases over time. Sometimes people do not want to listen to the truth or to look at reality. We have to wait for the right moment to help them accept their reality.

Only when the disciples had finished did Jesus begin to talk. Then he took up the story where they had left off and opened their minds to a new way of looking at the Scriptures. But it was not until all was over that the disciples really understood what had happened to them on that journey. But isn't this how it always is in real life? We live our lives forward, but understand them backwards. We never know at the time what is happening to us. We have no perspective, no understanding. We have enough to do to cope from day to day or hour to hour. It is only afterwards, perhaps long afterwards, that our eyes are opened and we begin to understand that experience; hence the importance of reflecting on our experiences. Eventually we may even be grateful for that sad experience because we are better off for having gone through it. And so we begin to understand the message of Jesus' death and resurrection – glory attained through suffering.

We don't expect to find God in pain. We expect to find him in joy. This was the great discovery the two disciples made on their journey to Emmaus. It gave meaning to suffering. A meaning to our pain does not remove it, but changes our attitude towards it. It enabled the disciples to turn their lives around. They were going away from Jerusalem. They had lost their faith. But now, after their encounter with Jesus and their understanding of the meaning of suffering, they returned to Jerusalem and resumed their discipleship and their ties with the community. The encounter was not meant to foster the evasion of responsibility but to encourage commitment.

The lives of each one of us can be looked on as a series of stories which coalesce over time to form one story. However, the sad fact is that all our stories end in death. We do not want stories that end like that. We want stories that end happily. Jesus helped the disciples to share their story so that it could mingle with his. Likewise he invites us to bring the stories of our life to him so that he can make them into a part of his own and make ours a part of his. The resurrection of Jesus opens all our stories to the prospect, not just of a good ending, but of a glorious ending. The first and last words of each of our stories belong to God.

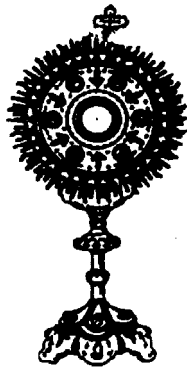
