## God Invites Us In

None of us likes to be left out. For instance, a wedding is coming up to which you expect to be invited. However, when the invitations are sent out, we don't receive one. This hurts, sometimes a great deal. We feel excluded. We feel that we are not wanted.

Of course, we have to look at ourselves and see how generous we are when it comes to inviting other people in. From time to time people come to our door. Some we dismiss immediately, barely exchanging a word with them. Others we have a polite but brief chat with at the door, without bringing them into the house. Others we bring into the parlor where we talk business, and when that business is concluded we show them to the door. But others are a select few whom we welcome, invite in immediately, and offer them food and drink.

There is a beautiful Russian icon of the Blessed Trinity painted by a monk by name of Rublev. It depicts the three Divine Persons sitting at a table. A dish of food lies on the table. But the thing that immediately strikes you is the fact that at the front of the table there is a vacant place. The vacant place is meant to convey openness, hospitality, and welcome towards the stranger and the outsider.

That vacant place is meant for each of us, and for all the human family. It signifies God's invitation to us to share in the life of the Trinity. God doesn't exclude us. God doesn't talk to us at the doorstep. God invites us to come in and sit at the table. God wants to share the Divine life with us. In the words of the Gospel for this feast: "God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son..."

Many are intimidated by the great mystery of the Blessed Trinity. This is not meant to be so. We should see the Father, Son and Holy Spirit as friends to whom we can relate, and to whom we can talk in prayer because, God's Son, Jesus Christ, befriended us: we are no longer strangers and outsiders. We are God's children; we are part of God's family.

God has already given to us a place at the banquet here on earth. We share at the Eucharist. But God wants us to have a share at the heavenly banquet of eternal life as well. Only at God's table here, and at the eternal banquet, can we find nourishment our hearts are hungering for. From all this, we see that God is a God of love. Our response can only be one of trust in God and love towards one another. What St Paul said to the Corinthians is meant also for us: "Help one another. Be united; live in peace, and the God of love and peace will be with you".

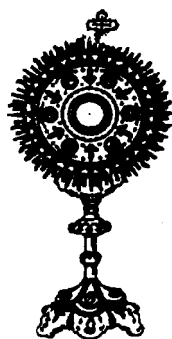

## Family Corner

### 10 Ways to Help Children Cope With Worry (7-10)

Coping with worry is an important life skill children need to acquire. Try these ideas to give comfort and help develop healthy coping skills.

**7. Hold family meetings.** Healthy communication is especially important when families are facing challenges. Regular family meetings are a good way to share information in a neutral way and great opportunities for family prayer.

**8. Watch for signs of stress.** Children show their worry by changes in the way they act. They may change the way they eat or sleep, be more irritable than usual, have nightmares. Sit your child down for a comforting talk if you see signs of stress. Consult your pediatrician if you become concerned.

**9. Whistle while you worry.** If money is a concern, make a game out of saving it. See how much fun you can have on as little as possible. Simple suppers eaten on a blanket in the living room put focus on fun, not deprivation. Letting children help address the family concerns gives them the feeling that they are contributing to the solution.

**10. Play.** Bring out board games or cards, draw pictures or read books together. Large motor activities help worried children (and adults) use up anxious energy. Plat tag. Throw around a ball. Ride bikes. Have some fun so you can redirect everyone's thoughts to something more pleasant than worry. Laughter is still the best medicine.
