Dear parishioners,

PATIENCE IS DIVINE

We judge and classify other people through our own eye glasses. Those who think and behave differently from us fall under our sledge hammer. We may be impatient with others, but God is very patient with us and with all. He knows us through and through and, in the parable of the weeds, he wants to take all of us to his school of patience. He knows that this is one vice common to all at varying degrees. Many Christians consider themselves a group of "just people" surrounded by an evil world. Some of us have often wondered why God has not intervened to wipe out evil people, or at least, punish them so they could learn their lesson and stop making things difficult for the good ones. God seems too patient with wicked people. Sometimes, we even threaten God's punishment on these 'bad' people all around us. Some don't go to Church anymore because some people they considered very evil still attend. If we had the power of God, some people would no longer be on this planet. But, fortunately, we don't. God thinks differently and would want us to learn from Him. He is all powerful and at the same time all merciful. Our First Reading says of Him, "Your mastery over all things makes you lenient to all." (Wisdom 12:16)

Our salvation lies in becoming more and more like God. And God is doing everything possible to restore his image and likeness in us who have been disfigured by sin. Our thinking has also been disfigured by our sinful weakness. Even our prayer is often stained by selfishness and self-righteousness. Only the Spirit of God, who prays "according to the mind of God", can help us pray properly. In doing so he schools us in God's type of patience. To grow in God is to grow in patient love, because as we draw closer to God we know better; we become slower to judge and condemn other people. The closer we get to Him, the more we beam the searchlight inwards and begin to change the world from inside us and to accommodate others.

There is good and evil in every person. And only the all holy God knows how much he puts up with our imperfections. If He were to send fire from heaven to destroy evil people on earth, only animals would remain. God is patient with all, not only because he sees the whole picture of each person's composition, historical background and life situations, but also because he wants to give everyone enough opportunity to repent and be saved. Impatience is also a vice from which God waits for us to repent and be saved. Every day as we go through the thick and thin of our lives, through the grocery shop queues, the traffic lights, the disturbing news of terrorist attacks, the heart-break of job layoffs, and some annoying human characters, God is constantly drilling into us the big lesson of patience. Patience is real growth. Patience makes us aware that there are many things about each of us that are clearly beyond our choices, like family, sex, height and our racial and ethnic origins. All these greatly influence the way we think and behave. We are all human, but need to grow to be divine. To be truly God's children, we must grow in patience daily, because God is the maker of all and is patient with all, including us.

Baptism

Are you expecting a baby? Don't wait until that hectic time **after** you have your baby, plan to attend before your delivery date. **Preparation is required** if you are presenting a child for baptism for the **first time**. Confirmation 2011

Throughout the Sacramental history of our Church a baptized believer had to have their **baptism confirmed before** he or she was able to eat at the Eucharistic table. Up until 1910 this was the norm, however Pius X changed the law governing the **reception of the Eucharist** to include all the baptized, once they reached the age of reason.

However the canons of the church still state that any child, aged 7 or older, is to be afforded the opportunity to be prepared for this, the second, of the three **Sacraments of Initiation**, Baptism, Confirmation, & Eucharist. It is not expected that a child will, at a young age, understand a commitment to their faith for their lifetime, but a child will understand that their parent said "yes" for them at Baptism and now they can say "yes" for themselves; they can say "yes" to our Lord.

Please note, a child, who is confirmed at 7 or 8 years of age, will then receive their First Eucharist at the same time as that of the rite of Confirmation, as the church originally celebrated.

This year Confirmation will be celebrated on November 8th.

If you are interested in presenting your child for this Sacrament, please call Marianne Logan at 324-7121, 382-1484, **after August 23rd.**

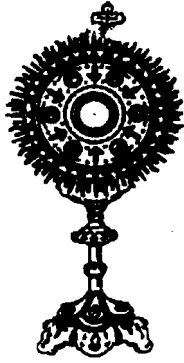
