Dear parishioners,

ONLY HUMBLE PEOPLE EXPERIENCE GOD

Last weekend, we celebrated our unity in the One Body and Blood of Christ. We recalled that we belong together as one family of God in Christ. God made it clear that we could not live without Christ in us. Christ came to give us this life. A life we must nourish through the word of God and the Eucharist. Taking the human form, lying in the manger, dying shamefully on the cross and finally bringing himself so low as to become food and drink for human beings in the form of bread and wine was clearly a path of humility for Christ. If Christ was so humble, then to belong to him, we must also be as humble. In the Gospel of today, he calls out to us, "Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves." The yoke of Christ is to obey his simple guidelines for salvation, to simply and humbly follow his leading without much intellectual arguments and doubts. He calls it yoke because it requires obedience, but compared to disobedience it is less burdensome. A Christian understands pain and goes through it with peace of mind, but a non-Christian sees only pain and sometimes hopelessness.

Christ rejoices greatly that the Life of God he has brought on earth is accessible to the lowliest people and can only be missed by those who choose the path of pride. Christ does not delight in the loss of any soul; rather he is glad that the means of salvation are brought so low that anyone who gets lost has no excuses. This is not to say that the life of the spirit is an easy one. In the Second Reading of today, St. Paul denounced the life in the flesh as death and declared that only those who live according to the Spirit can really live. Living according to the Spirit rather than the flesh is a daily struggle every Christian goes through. It is not an easy road; but the help of Christ is made available within the church to those humble enough to accept them. The power of his Spirit is released to the little ones who acknowledge their weakness and hunger and come to the mother Church for the bread of the Word of God and the Sacraments of salvation. The victory of salvation is not won on the back of horses and chariots but on asses and donkeys. Humility is a golden virtue and only humble people experience God.

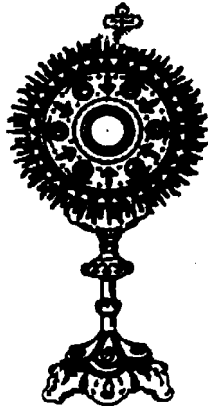
