Dear Parishioners,

This weekend, we are again called upon to get more and more involved in Christian charity. The opportunity to do charity is golden. We should remain grateful to God that we are able to show love, since that is an attribute of God. Charity makes us divine and at the same time fully human. In fact, it is our only certificate as Christians. The readings of this weekend harp steadily on this same string. God invites us to use our temporal goods to purchase eternal good. "I tell you, make friends for yourselves with dishonest wealth, so that when it fails, you will be welcomed into eternal dwellings" (Lk. 16:9). God identifies with the poor and expects us to recognize and serve Him in them.

Many of us here are deeply involved in various forms of charitable deeds. Some are public, others private. We are encouraged never to give up and indeed never to set a limit to our charitable deeds, even when no one seems to notice or spur us on. God sees and sets no limit to His love for us. We can copy some examples of charity around us, but our model remains Christ.

For a couple of weeks now, we are besieged with general requests to give out some money to assist in one poverty alleviation program or the other, no thanks to the recent economic melt down that has hit many families and individuals here and around the world. We thank God for the various groups of individuals that champion the course of the poor. Let us always give them as much support as we can. They offer us the golden opportunity to serve God in the poor. And no matter how poor we may be, we have something to offer, if not money, time.

Last two weekends, it was food for the poor; this weekend, it is Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD). Next weekend is National Catholic Charities Sunday, and we shall be hearing from Catholic Charities of Steuben County and Kinship Family & Youth Services. May we never get tired of responding to cries for help, whether from near or far.

Finally, I will draw our attention again to the appeal earlier made by our Pastor, Fr. Peter, before he left for vacation, concerning our church doors. The winter is around the corner and the doors are no longer leak-proof. The bulletin insert this weekend details out our work plan for these doors and presents the same appeal for help. Wonderful, if we consider helping.

May God who can never be out done in charity bless you all.

Core Programs of Catholic Charities of Steuben County:

Turning Point - offers food, short-term financial assistance, financial counseling, and referrals to other resources and support services. Programs include Mentoring, Homeless/Housing Programs, Food Pantry, Emergency Services, Prescription Assistance, Nutrition Outreach & Education.

Bath Community Day Care - provides reliable day care service for infants and children up to age twelve with a focus on affordability and quality.

Justice and Peace/Parish Services - works to influence public policy and provide community education ensuring the needs of all people and the voice of the Church are represented while building relationships of cooperation within the faith community.

Prevention Services, Bath Area Hope for Youth, Steuben Council on Addictions - provides services to youth aimed at preventing substance abuse and other destructive behaviors. Programs include Prevention Education, Information and Referral Services, Screenings, Drinking Driver Prevention and John B. Southard Summer Recreation.

Core Programs of Kinship Family & Youth Services:

Healthy Families Steuben - provides home-based education and parent development services to expectant parents and parents with newborns in Steuben County, from locations in Addison, Bath and Hornell.

Family Preservation (SHAPE) - provides in-home guidance, instruction and support to parents with children at risk of out-of-home placement due to abuse and neglect, from locations in Belmont, Bath, Hornell and Penn Yan.

Therapeutic Foster Care Services - aims to guide each child with their family toward a timely and successful transition back to home, school, and community. Therapeutic foster homes specialize in serving hard-to-place children and adolescents, with clinical counseling services provided to guide the development and support of treatment planning goals of each child and family.

Chemical Dependency Services - offers community residential and supportive living apartments in a structured and rehabilitative environment for those recovering from alcoholism and other chemical addictions.
