Dear Parishioners,

Another striking wake-up call is coming from our readings this weekend. This time we are presented with the terrible consequences of omission. Our vocation as Christians requires a growing sensitivity to the human situations around us. Social inequality is a normal human experience everywhere. We are not all equally gifted. Some people for some reasons are in more serious crises than others, especially financial crises. It is not over-emphasis for the message of Christian charity to reappear this weekend; it is that important.

As a faith family, let us try harder to bridge the gap between the rich man and the Lazarus in our neighbourhood. The rich man in our gospel message cannot claim he did not see Lazarus because he lay "at his door". Jesus, our Master, teaches us today that we may be condemned, not for committing any sin, but for doing nothing when we should do something to help someone.

Replacement of St. Ann's Church Exterior Doors

We remain ever grateful to all of you our parishioners for your very sincere effort and contributions towards the sustenance and growth of our parish. We appeal again to your generosity concerning the replacement of St. Ann's Church Exterior Doors. Last week, we inserted into the bulletin a detailed proposal of the options and the requirements for the doors. Here again I repeat a part of the information and request contained in that insert:

The total cost per door is \$6,000. With two doors per opening, we will need \$48,000 for the four exterior openings in the Church. Any amount of donation is welcome. You can put your donation in an envelope, label it DOORS and put it in the collection or drop it off at the Parish Office. Part of the plan is to have a door or an opening (two doors) labelled with a plaque "Parishioners Door". Another possibility would be that your family could together donate a door and have it named after your family or someone you would want remembered. Two daughters of a parishioner have picked up an opening (\$12,000) in memory of their late parents. At the moment, we need \$36,000 to complete the full project. You can help.

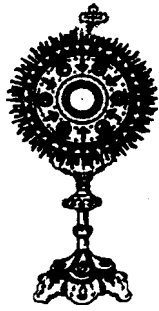
